FACT CHECK: Sparklers burn at 1200 degrees Fahrenheit, which is hotter than the temperature needed to melt glass! One quarter of emergency room firework injulie are as a result of using sparklers. Don't get burned!

Grill season is upon us! Here are some reminders to keep you safe while grilling your favorite summer foods: keep grills far away from anything that can burn including your home, cars, and dry vegetation; stay with the grill when lighted, and keep children and pets well away from the area; and, wear a heavy apron and an oven mitt that fits high up over your forearm. Keep recycling loose, never bagged, inside your cart.






