Compost Your Holiday Greenery

It may seem natural to toss an old Christmas tree away by a creek, but that can increase streambank erosion, or lead to clogged culverts and flooding. Here are two options to compost your greenery:

- Place Christmas trees and other natural decorations at the curb by 7 a.m. for your weekly yard waste collection.
- During operating hours, drop your tree off at the designated yard waste area at the Citizen's Convenience Center, 313 N. Dixon Ave.
