ROAD IMPROVEMENTS! The Kildaire Farm Road Improvements Project in Downtown Cary is nearing completion. This multi-faceted project includes transportation safety, utility and aesthetic improvements to a key downtown gateway. The project improved Kildaire Farm Road alignment for northbound traffic, installed Accessible Pedestrian Signals and pedestrian-level lighting, replaced watermains and buried utility lines. Landscaping will be installed in the newly constructed median this fall.
