Fertilizing this Fall?

Excess and stray fertilizer becomes a pollutant when washed into storm drains that lead to waterways. Smart fertilizing keeps our streams healthy and our lawns lush. Follow manufacturer guidelines to apply the right amount, and sweep fertilizer that falls on hard surfaces back onto your lawn.



Excess Cardboard

Flatten and/or cut boxes to fit in your recycling cart with the lid closed. Avoid cramming so all recyclables can empty into our trucks. If you have more boxes than will fit in your cart, drop them off at the Citizen's Convenience Center, 313 N. Dixon Ave. Or request a free cardboard collection at services.townofcary.org or by calling 311.



Creepy Contaminants

Redistricting: Reflecting a Changing Cary

On June 24, Cary Town Council adopted a new map of municipal electoral district boundaries, which went into immediate effect. This helps maintain a population balance so that each person's vote counts about the same during municipal elections. With these changed boundaries, many precincts have moved but none were split or added. You may see a change in your district which also means you could have a new Council representative. Municipal Elections Delayed

Typically, Municipal elections are held in odd-numbered years. The mayor and all Council members serve four-year terms. Due to the passage of Session Law 2021-56, Cary's elections will be delayed until March 8, 2022.
