Be Alarmed!

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an invisible gas-you can't see it or smell it, and it could be lurking in any level of your home. If you have any gas appliances, an attached garage, or heat with a non-electric source, you need a carbon monoxide alarm which is designed to detect dangerous levels of the odorless gas. CO alarms can be can be battery-operated, plug-in, or hardwired into your home and can be purchased from local retailers. They should be installed outside of each sleeping area but, for best protection, place one on every floor of your home. Test your alarms monthly when you test your smoke alarms and be sure to replace them every seven (7) years. If your carbon monoxide alarm sounds an alarm, get to fresh air and call 911.

America Recycles Day Shred: Join us for a free paper shred on November 16 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Bring up to three boxes of paper to 400 James Jackson Ave. No commercial interests, please. Proof of Cary residency is required.

Winterizing: Winterize your irrigation system now to prevent a mess later. Drain the system to prevent:

- (1) water in the backflow preventer assembly,
- (2) pipes from freezing, and
- (3) cracked lines and sprayheads.

Also, remove your backflow preventer assembly and store it in a warm place.
